Title:	Use By and Expiry Dates on Consumable Items	
Priority		Amber – Audit Rating: Opportunity to Improve / Non-Conformance-Minor
Legislation:	PUWER, HASWA S.6, The General Product Safety Regulations 2005	
Brief Description:	During SafeHire audits a range of consumable items are found to be 'out of date' and questions are asked regarding use and disposal of such items. In addition consumables mounted to off-hire equipment are stored for re-use.	
Kit Affected:	Abrasive wheels / discs, PPE items e.g. Hard-hats, safety harnesses / lanyards, chemical fixing / anchor supplies, nailgun gas / fuel cells and similar products.

Used discs returned on off-hired equipment saved for potential re-use.

Expiry date or code should be stamped as below. V01/2002 = Use By January 2002



Expiry date - V10/2005 = October 2005



Hard hat – expiry 09/2006 – September 06





Recommended
Actions:

Review stock holdings, dispose of out-of-date consumables safely i.e. to prevent re-use. Some suppliers are able to re-certify expiry dates on discs and abrasive wheels which may be appropriate for higher value items. Contact your supplier for more information. Discs that are out of date **should not** be re-sold or discounted. Used discs removed from returned equipment should also be disposed of safely even if in-date as their condition and use is unknown.

**note:** some hard hats have a date stamp for date of manufacture as does work at height equipment e.g. Harness & Lanyard. As before contact your supplier for further advice on life expectancy and use-by dates.
